Rising Star Awards Shining a spotlight on the female talent pipeline across the UK

20 leading organisations rally behind WeAreTheCity to find the UK's future female leaders

Over the past three years WeAreTheCity has unveiled some of the country's most talented women through their annual Rising Star awards. Previous awards have played a vital part in highlighting female talent across the country. Our past winners have gone on to achieve press and media attention, promotions from their organisations, MBE's, BEM's and industry recognition for their work. In 2018, these highly successful awards will once again celebrate 100 individual female contributors who represent industry leaders and role models of the future.

Given the increasing focus of women in the workplace, WeAreTheCity are more determined than ever to shine a spotlight on female talent and encourage companies to invest in their women by creating environments which enable them to thrive within their organisations. Founded in 2015, the objective of the awards was to highlight the achievements of 500 women by 2018, we are set to exceed that target by August. WeAreTheCity has since extended its Rising Star target to highlight the achievements of 1000 women by 2022.

It is fantastic to be working with The Times and The Sunday Times for the second year running, and to once again be working with a variety of companies who are actively supporting the gender agenda. This year we will recognise the achievements of a further 100 future female leaders across a multitude of industries within the UK. We know that highlighting the achievements of these women, leads to action and opportunities. Over 25 per cent of our previous winners have since been promoted or taken on additional responsibilities since winning the Rising Star awards. It is going to be a great year for our next cohort of Rising Stars and I am excited to see all the nominations coming through."

WeAreTheCity feels it has a responsibility to ensure that female talent, regardless of age and background, receives the necessary support to transition into key decision-making roles within our organisations.
