WHAT ARE THE RISING STAR AWARDS?



The Rising Star Awards are the first to focus on the UK's female talent pipeline below directorlevel and to support it's winners through on-going learning and networking opportunities, long after the award's process has concluded.

Now in their tenth year, the Rising Star Awards are the first to focus on the achievements of women below Senior Management or Director level – representing the female talent pipeline and the next generation of future leaders.

The awards also recognise the efforts of senior leaders who are championing gender equality, as well as putting the spotlight on a "company of the year" that is actively supporting its female talent pipeline above and beyond industry norms.

Over the past nine years and with the support of leading organisations, WeAreTheCity has been able to highlight the achievements of over 950 women (850 in the UK, 100 in India) through the Rising Star Awards process.

RISING STAR AWARDS BACKGROUND



- We have been seeking incredible diverse women since 2015
- To date, we have a family of 950 Rising Stars,
 100 in India, and 850 across the UK
- We are primarily interested in women below director level
- There are no age limits on our awards
- Rising Stars is a two-step process Short nomination (either self or from someone else), then supporting information from individual
- There is no cost to enter our awards

- We welcome nominations from all individuals who choose to identify as women
- Our judges reflect our community
- We are one of a few awards that provide education opportunities, e.g. membership to CMI, learning day at WBS
- You don't have to be nominated by your company to enter!

RISING STAR AWARDS CATEGORIES



Individual: A female individual who works within one of the categories whose current position is below director level.

Champion: A senior individual of any gender who is championing gender equality either inside or outside their organisation.

Men for Gender Balance: A senior man who is championing women and gender balance either inside or outside their organisation.

Company: A company that clearly articulates their commitment to supporting their female talent pipeline.

Global Achiever: A female individual from outside the UK, across any industry, whose current position is below director level.

WHY IS IT STOPPING YOU?



Weak-TheCity

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- It may feel like you a putting yourself out there
- Your imposter syndrome may be on fire (questioning your achievements)
- You might feel it's a bit like bragging or boasting (especially when penning your nomination or if you get shortlisted)
- You might be worried about what other people will think
- You might feel like you haven't done enough to enter an awards or need to do more
- You might disagree with the fact that awards are a great platform for you to spring from



MONINATION? GOOD



- It's not rushed
- It tells a story and captivates the reader
- We get to know you, your background and whatever history you choose to share
- What have you overcome to get where you are?
- It shouldn't be just a list of previous achievements, we need a little context!
- It shouldn't be pages and pages be concise
- Detail how have you helped others, where have you lifted as you have climbed?

- Detail cause and effect, where have you made an impact and what did that impact lead to?
- It contains context, numbers, breadth and scope
- Where have you gone above and beyond?
- Did you do anything innovative to deliver an outcome?
- Self nominations are awesome!



WHAT ARE OUR JUDGES LOOKING FOR?



- That you meet the criteria for the awards
- That you have spent time on your nomination/supporting information and it shows (spelling, layout, easy to read)
- You are telling your judge a story
- Your achievements and impact are there clearly for us to see, you have used cause and effect.
 This is the problem, this is how I solved it (and here are some bells and whistles I added too!)
- We can see you putting things in place or delivering initiatives that also help others

 lifting as you climb, paying it forward (this could be helping younger generations, enabling others to learn, sharing your experiences)
- Examples of where you have defied the odds to achieve your goals
- Where you may have taken some risks



RISING STARS 2024 AWARDS PLATFORM

Step 1

- Create an account with your details
- Choose which category your nomination best fits in to
- Select if you are nominating yourself or someone else
- Complete all the required information
- Submit nomination when ready (you can save and go back to your nomination at a later date, before submitting)
- Your nominee will receive an email with next steps

Step 2 (Self-nominations only)

- Check your inbox/spam/junk folder for your link to submit your supporting information
- Complete supporting information (save as you go)
- Review and submit

IMPORTANT REMINES

RISING STARS Wear-TheCity

- Don't underplay your achievements!
- Avoid listing every single certification summarise, highlighting the most impactful
- Try not to write a statement without explaining the impact
- Always ask someone to review
- Remember, what you write in your bio will be published!
- Get the headshot right!
- Save what you write
- You have until 21 March to submit your nomination and your supporting information
